Because the Rev. Dr. Ron Oelrich, Pastor at Faith UCC for over twenty years, his wife the Rev. Sue Oelrich, Pastor at Locust Grove UCC and former Chaplain at Pleasant Acres Nursing Home, and their daughter, Stephanie Oelrich, who recently received her Master's of Divinity degree from LTS, are moving to Missouri to be closer to their son and his family, it is appropriate to remember and give thanks for Rev. Dr. Oelrich's service to the York Association.

Of course, no one in the Association called him Rev. Dr. Oelrich. He was always Ron, an unprepossessing, warm, and upbeat presence wherever and however he served. Most recently he served on the Council as Vice-President for two years, and then President for two years. During that time, he was known for sitting in on many Committee meetings ex officio, and for worshipping at other churches in the Association whenever he could. He had more knowledge of the life of the Association than anyone else. As President, he encouraged other Pastors to submit articles to the Association newsletter about the life of their congregations. His contagious enthusiasm for the churches in the Association led him to think outside the box and look to the future with hope. When others were disappointed with the lack of volunteers, Ron would say, "Look at who we are blessed with!"

Prior to leading the Council, Ron served on the Committee on Ministry for six years, the last two years as Chair. In this role he offered hospitality and encouragement to Members in Discernment seeking ordination, and to clergy new to the Association, and clear-eyed wisdom in situations of conflict.

He served our Association in countless other ways through the years, and we are thankful to God for his long season of ministry among us.



Cam Richesson Approved for Ordination

Called to Dover UCC as their Bridge Pastor last fall, and as their settled Pastor last winter, Cam Richesson was approved for Ordination by *all* the delegates at the York Association Ecclesiastical Council held on May 5. Raised in the United Methodist Church (her father was a Methodist pastor) in Pennsylvania, Cam for several decades postponed a call to ministry while working as a counselor in the criminal justice system. Finally relenting to God's call, she went to LTS where she was immersed in UCC's culture and values and received her Master's of Divinity degree. Realizing that she felt most at home in the UCC, she sought ordination in our denomination. Our York Association joins with Dover UCC in thanking God for calling Cam to ordained ministry in our midst. We welcome Cam and her wife, Nancy, into our Association!

Service Marks Closure of St. Paul's UCC in Dallastown

A moving service of closure on May 6 celebrated the ministry of St. Paul's UCC in Dallastown. Much of the congregation, three York Association clergy, the Rev. Dr. Carrie Call, and several other clergy were present. The Rev. Dr. Chris Rodkey led the service. Rev. Rodkey was called in 2013. Even then the congregation's future was uncertain. Perhaps the most significant aspect of this last decade was the Open and Affirming Covenant the congregation developed and lived out. This covenant was in deep congruence with the congregation's values of serving the vulnerable and marginalized. In closing the church's consistory announced plans to distribute its assets in ways consonant with its values. A check for \$25,000 was given to True Tabernacle Seventh Day Adventist Church, which had purchased the building, and a \$90,000 check was given to the Penn Central Conference to support the Conference's Open and Affirming Task Force, its camping ministry, and the Conference's many other needful ministries.
